2016 Bishop's Appeal Update. . .

The most recent *Appeal* data is. . . Since the last statistic report, we received **4** new gifts totaling **\$160.00**. As of this bulletin, a total of **262** Cabrini Households have participated in this parish wide responsibility to the Diocese or **29.2%** of the parish family (**262/898**). These **262** households have contributed **\$26,462** of our assessed goal of **\$35,700** or **74.1%** of goal. **Average gift stands at \$101**. It would be fantastic if the remaining **636** Cabrini Households (or **71%**) would jump in, join those who have already contributed and help close the remaining **\$9,238 (26% of goal) gap**. Thanks so much to the group of **262!** I pray the Lord inspire the group of **636** to help bear the responsibility we have as a parish to the Diocese and join the effort! Remember, any *Appeal* shortfall has to be paid out of our ordinary parish income and *ouch*. . .that hurts us! *Fr. Martin*

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: 1 Kings 17:17-24

The child of the mistress of the house where Elijah sojourned became ill and died. The woman pleaded with Elijah who took the son and prayed over him. When the child revived Elijah returned him to his mother who recognized Elijah as "a man of God."

Second Reading: Galatians 1:11-19

Paul proclaims the gospel, not as human, but coming from the revelation of Jesus Christ. Paul continues to acknowledge his own sinfulness and call to grace.

Gospel: Luke 7:11-17

The gospel continues to recount the miracles and healing powers of Jesus. As Jesus neared the gates to the city of Nain, they came upon a deceased young man who was being carried out of the city. His mother, a widow, and a large crowd accompanying the body, met Jesus on the way. Compassionately, Jesus comforts the weeping mother and restores life to the dead man.
