### 2016 Bishop's Appeal Update...

As of June 14<sup>th</sup>, our most recent *Appeal* data is . . . since the last statistic report, we received **3** new gifts totaling **\$100.00**. As of this bulletin report, a total of **265** Cabrini Households have participated in this parish-wide responsibility to the Diocese or **29.5%** of the parish family (**265/898**). These 265 households have contributed \$26,562 of our assessed goal of \$35,700 or 74.4% of goal. Average gift stands at \$100.24. It would be fantastic if the remaining **633** Cabrini Households (or **71%**) would jump in, join those who have already contributed and help close the remaining **\$9,138 (26% of goal)** gap needed to complete the appeal. Thanks so much to the group of **265!** I pray the Lord inspire the group of **633** to help bear the responsibility we have as a parish to the Diocese and join the effort! *Large, small or in the middle. . . everyone's participation and contribution is important!* Remember, any *Appeal* shortfall has to be paid out of our ordinary parish income and *ouch. . .* that hurts us! *Fr. ## Church Sewer Update. . .

We've come to a positive resolution concerning the sewer problems which have plagued the sewer line coming out of the church building and runs along Shamokin Street. After meeting with officials from the local sewer authority, it was decided that the authority will replace the entire sewer line from the curb in front of the office building down to Clay Street where the line connects. This is a major saving to the parish. Initially, I thought the parish would have to pay for repairing the defects in the sewer pipe. However, the parish does have to pay

Roto Rooter for the services they provided and for the patching of the sidewalk. Please be a little more generous in your offertory collection in the coming weeks to help pay for this repair. ## **Important Notice & A Call to Action:**

A piece of legislation is being formulated in the Pennsylvania State legislature regarding a retroactive nullification of the statutes of limitations for filing a civil lawsuit alleging childhood sexual abuse which could have dire consequences for our Catholic community. As proposed, it would force parishes, diocese schools, and charities to defend cases that are 20, 30 or 40 years old, long after the perpetrator and possible eye witnesses have died or clear evidence is gone. It could lead to the closure of parishes, schools, and ministries of today's

Catholics, who are in no way responsible for abuse that occurred decades ago.

As proposed, a retroactive nullification of these statues would open the floodgates for lawsuits against private and nonprofit organizations, BUT IT WOULD NOT APPLY TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS OR GOVERNMENT AGENCIES. Public entities would still be able to claim "sovereign immunity" from lawsuits, even though the vast majority of Pennsylvania students - 83% - attend public school.



Survivors abused in public schools, juvenile detentions facilities, or country foster care programs could not bring suits under the legislation. This provision is clearly unfair and is designed to target the

Catholic Church.

Sexual abuse is a serious crime that affects every institutions and community in Pennsylvania, public and private. Concerning the Bill HB 1947, the Pennsylvania Catholic Conference DOES NOT oppose the elimination of the criminal statue of limitations. The Harrisburg Diocese supports and agrees that anyone who sexually abuses a child should be severely punished by the law. Sexual predators should be locked behind bars and removed from society so they cannot hurt anyone else. Criminal Cases require a burden of proof that is beyond a reasonable doubt and fairness is built into the system with many checks and balances. Any discussion of a legislative remedy must protect ALL children, not simply penalize some institutions.

In civil cases, anyone can file a civil suit with a much lower burden of proof. An alleged abuser may not even still be alive, but a third party, like his or her employer, could be sued even after the perpetrator, possible witnesses or clear evidence is long gone. Removing this fairness from our judicial system would make it impossible for any organization that cares for children to defend itself in court years later.

The Catholic Church has learned hard lessons regarding child sexual abuse and has taken responsibility for the abuse that has occurred within its ranks.

The Catholic Dioceses across Pennsylvania have implemented changes that offer assistance and support to abuse survivors.

Furthermore, all employees and volunteers within the Harrisburg Diocese and who have contact with children

must take courses and be certified by state agencies for suitability in the workplace.

Everyone is urged to contact their state lawmakers regarding Bill HB 1947 and oppose unfair changes to the civil statute of limitations.

**Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**First Reading: Zechariah 12:10-11, 13:1**

Zechariah describes the mourning that will occur over Jesus' crucifixion. The people of Jerusalem will mourn him as they would mourn an only son or a fallen king.

**Second Reading: Galatians 3:26-29**

Paul reinforces that all those who accept Christ are equal in God's eyes. Man or woman, Jew or Greek, is unimportant in God's eyes if you have true faith in Jesus.

**Gospel: Luke 9:18-24**

Jesus asks the disciples who they think he is. They reply that he is the Messiah. Jesus forbids them to tell this to others, and explains that first

he must suffer, be put to death, and rise up on the third day. He explains to them that they also must be willing to suffer for his sake if they wish to be saved.
