Church Sewer Update. . .

We've come to a positive resolution concerning the sewer problems which have plagued the sewer line coming out of the church building and runs along Shamokin Street. After meeting with officials from the local sewer authority, it was decided that the authority will replace the entire sewer line from the curb in front of the office building down to Clay Street where the line connects. This is a major saving to the parish. Initially, I thought the parish would have to pay for repairing the defects in the sewer pipe. However, the parish does have to pay Roto Rooter for the services they provided and for the patching of the sidewalk. Please be a little more generous in your offertory collection in the coming weeks to help pay for this repair. Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:16b, 19-21

Elijah the prophet followed God's instruction to appoint a man named Elisha as his successor. Elijah threw his cloak over Elisha, who went and said good-bye to his family, then followed Elijah without question.

Second Reading: Galatians 5:1, 13-18

Paul reminds us that people were freed from the old law through Christ. But he makes it clear that this freedom does not mean giving in to evil desires. Instead, we must be guided by the Spirit and most importantly love our neighbor as ourselves.

Gospel: Luke 9:51-62

Jesus set out for Jerusalem, and passed through a town where he was not welcomed. He reprimanded his disciples for desiring vengeance against the town. One man wanted to follow Jesus when he had finished his duties at home. Jesus expressed that a man who begins a task, but constantly looks back is unfit for the reign of God.
