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<p>IT'S A “HOLY DAY” BUT NOT A . . . “HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION”</p> <p>The Catholic Church teaches as dogma that the Virgin Mary "having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory". This doctrine was dogmatically defined by Pope Pius XII on November 1, 1950.</p> <p>This year, August 15th, the Assumption of Mary into heaven, falls on a Monday. At times, confusion of “obligation” may result when such holy days fall in close proximity to Sunday, the Lord’s Day, as is the case this year. To clarify. . . August 15th, the Assumption of Mary remains a <i>Holy Day</i>, worthy of the faithful attending Mass in celebration of this great honor bestowed upon Mary, the Mother of God. However, the “<i>obligation</i>” to attend Mass on this <i>Holy Day</i> has been lifted by the Bishop of Harrisburg for this year. Mother Cabrini Parish will celebrate two Masses for the convenience of the faithful on August 15, one at 8:00AM and a second at 5:00PM. No Vigil Mass for the Assumption will be celebrated on Sunday, August 14th.</p>

33 Cabrini Households Come on Board!

In response to our 2016 *Bishop's Appeal* re-activation effort, thirty-three new Cabrini Households have come on board with their contributions. 31 Gifts were given through the parish. 2 were made "on line" and one previous donor added to an already existing gift. In total, \$2,295 was received! To date, 303 Mother Cabrini Households have taken up the responsibility of helping their parish with their gift/participation or 33.7% of our membership (303/898). \$29,342 of our \$35,700 goal has been raised (\$29,342/\$35,700) or 82.2%. *Average gift as of today is \$96.83.* We live in hope to hear from the 595 remaining Cabrini Households to help close the gap and put the *Appeal* to rest. My thanks to each and every one of the 303 Cabrini Households who have brought us so close to the finish line! *Fr. Martin*

'16 Cabrini Picnic \$\$ Report

We feel confident that all the bills are in and have been paid for our 2016, Mother Cabrini Parish Picnic. I am happy to report the following. . . All income (pre-picnic pierogi sales, raffle tickets, Lottery Calendars, picnic collection, Bake Sale, restricted picnic donations [including a \$1,000 donation from the St. Francis Club!], picnic concession/games etc.) yielded \$40,240.75. All expenses (food products, paper goods, permits, rental fees, utilities, mailings, printing etc.) related to the 2016 picnic came to \$13,885.05. *Net profit for the 2016 Cabrini Picnic was \$26,355.70.* Although our income was down \$3,271.25 from last year, our expenses were also down due to the wonderful and generous response of so many parishioners who donated paper goods, foil, cooking oil etc. That made a difference! To every person who worked in whatever capacity to make our 2016 a success, I thank you! To every parishioner who patronized the picnic, donated prizes/beautiful baskets and helped make it a success, I thank you most sincerely. It is inspiring to see so many parishioners working like this for the good of the parish. Thank you all! *Fr. Martin*
