2016 Bishop's Appeal Update. . .

This is an "off-week" for reporting new data but here is where we stand as a parish to date:

- 303 Cabrini Households have participated or 33.7% (303/898);
- Average gift as to date is \$96.83 (\$29,342/303);
- 595 Cabrini Households have yet to respond or 66.3% (595/898);
- \$29,342 has been raised or 82.2% (\$29,342/\$35,700) of goal.
