Can 64% of the Parish Help US!?!?

Yes, we are still waiting to hear from nearly **two-thirds** of the parish community (571 Cabrini Households) to help us wrap up the *2016 Bishop's Appeal*.

This is an "off-week" reporting bulletin so here is where we stand as of last week. . .

- **327** Cabrini Households have participated or **36.4%** of parish (327/898);
- Average gift to date is **\$94.49** (\$30,897/327);
- **571** Cabrini Households have yet to respond or **64%** (571/898) but could certainly help us reach our goal!;
- **\$30,897** has been raised or **86.6%** (\$30,897/\$35,700) of goal;

Sincere thanks to each of the **327** Cabrini Households who have helped us come so very close to our goal. You've done a great job! A gentle encouraging nudge to those **571** Cabrini Households (**64%** of the parish) to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese. Households who choose not to participate hurt the Parish in the long run because we have to divert regular and fund-raising income to cover the *Appeal* shortfall. Band of **571**, your participation can help us wrap up this effort in no time. Only \$4,803 remains to reach our goal!

October 2, 2016 TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

The prophet Habakkuk cries out despairingly to God because of the state Jerusalem has fallen into. He asks why God does nothing to stop the violence and misery. God assures him that a time will come when only the just and faithful will live.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

Paul writes to Timothy from prison and urges him to continue to spread the gospel without fear or shame. He also tells Timothy to draw upon the strength of the Holy Spirit to help him face the hardships he will encounter while preaching.

Gospel: Luke 17:5-10

The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus replies that "faith the size of a mustard seed could transplant a sycamore," indicating that a person either has faith, strong and complete, or none at all. Jesus also explains that a servant will not receive gratitude for simply following his master's orders. In the same way, we are all God's servants doing no more than our duty when we obey God's commands.
