Calling Out to the Band of 569!?!

Since our last statistic report, we have received two new additional gifts, totaling \$50.00 to the 2016 Bishop's Appeal. Those gifts help us to share the following positive results:

- **329** Cabrini Households have participated or **36.6%** of parish (329/898);
- Average gift to date is **\$94.06** (\$30,947/329);
- **569** Cabrini Households have yet to respond or **63%** (569/898) and could certainly help us reach our goal!;
- **\$30,947** has been raised or **86.68%** (\$30,947/\$35,700) of goal;

Sincere thanks to each of the **329** Cabrini Households who have helped us come ever so close to our goal. You've done a great job! A gentle encouraging nudge to those **569** Cabrini Households (**63%** of the parish) to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese. stove top stuffing/ instant mashed potatoes,
gravy, canned fruit, pudding/jello

S through Z:

peanut butter, jelly, crackers, cereal,
canned tuna or canned meat

First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17

Elisha cures Naaman of leprosy, which convinces Naaman that there is only one God. Naaman then asks to take some loads of soil from Israel, so that he can worship and make sacrifices to one true God on his own land.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13

Paul reminds Timothy that Christ rose from the dead so that many people could be saved. Paul was being treated as a criminal and kept in chains but says, "There is no chaining the word of God!" Paul also says, "if we die in Christ, we will live in him. But if we deny him, he will deny us."

Gospel: Luke 17:11-19

Jesus cures ten lepers, but only one returns to express gratitude for being healed. Jesus is disappointed that only one gave thanks to God, but tells that one, "Your faith has been your salvation."
