Band of 569, We Need Your Help!?!

This weekend is an “off week” for reporting *Bishop’s Appeal* statistics so I present where we stand as of last week:

- **329** Cabrini Households have participated or **36.6%** of parish (329/898);
- Average gift to date is **\$94.06** (\$30,947/329);
- **569** Cabrini Households have yet to respond or **63%** (569/898) and could certainly help us reach our goal!;
- **\$30,947** has been raised or **86.68%** (\$30,947/\$35,700) of goal;

Sincere thanks to each of the **329** Cabrini Households who have helped us come ever so close to our goal. You’ve done a great job! A gentle encouraging nudge to those **569** Cabrini Households (**63%** of the parish) to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese. Households who choose not to participate hurt the Parish in the long run because we have to divert regular and fund-raising income to cover the *Appeal* shortfall. First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13

Amalek and his people attacked the Israelites, so Moses instructed Joshua to lead some of the Israelites into battle the next day. While Moses kept his hands raised in prayer, the Israelites were winning. But when he put his hands down, they would begin to lose. So two others helped him keep his hands raised, and Joshua and the Israelites won the battle.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14—4:2

Paul tells Timothy that the Scriptures are inspired by God and are an excellent tool in teaching others about God's expectations of his people. Knowledge of the Scriptures, coupled with faith in Jesus, will lead many people to salvation. Paul urges Timothy to continue preaching the gospel, although this will sometimes be a difficult task.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Jesus speaks about a corrupt judge who lacked respect for either God or man. A widow repeatedly asked him to settle a case in her favor. He finally settled the case, only because he grew weary of listening to her requests. Jesus points out that if even this corrupt judge eventually listened, then God, who is just, will certainly answer the pleas of his people.
