

Bishop's Appeal Crosses the \$31K Mark!!

This past week, we received one new \$100 gift to the Bishop's Appeal which pushed the Appeal to a new total collected of **\$31,047!** The updated statistics are as follows:

- **330** Cabrini Households have participated or **37%** of parish (330/898);
- Average gift to date is **\$94.08** (\$31,047/330);
- **568** Cabrini Households have yet to respond or **63%** (568/898) and could certainly help us reach our goal!;
- **\$31,047** has been raised or **87%** (\$31,047/\$35,700) of goal;

Sincere thanks to each of the **330** Cabrini Households who have helped us come ever so close to our goal. You've done a very fine job, Kudos to you! A gentle encouraging nudge to those **568** Cabrini Households (**63%** of the parish) to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese. Households who choose not to participate hurt the Parish in the long run because we have to divert regular and fund-raising income to cover the *Appeal* shortfall. Cohort of **568**, your participation can help us wrap up this effort in no time. Only **\$4,653** remains to reach our goal. . . Spread out between **568** households. . . we can do it!

We are happy to report the results of our recent Chicken BBQ fund-raiser. . . **244** dinners were sold, we had additional "walk on" customers the day of the event and sold the surplus chicken halves. We received a **\$200** donation from the St. Francis Club in support of the effort as well as a **\$600** gift from a friend of Mother Cabrini who asked to remain anonymous. In addition, two very kind parishioners donated supplies for the BBQ which amounted to **\$220.83**. All totaled, the parish realized a profit of **\$1,969.46**. canned vegetables, canned or dried soup

J through R:

stove top stuffing/ instant mashed potatoes,
canned meat, gravy, canned fruit

S through Z:

peanut butter, jelly, crackers, cereal,
canned tuna, pudding/jello
