Parishioner Adds an Additional \$100 to Original Bishop's Appeal Gift

To help bring us to our “*O so close finish line,*” a parishioner has added an additional \$100 to their previous gift. This is the single gift we received in time for this updated report. Here’s where we stand:

- **330** Cabrini Households have participated or **36.8%** of parish (330/898);
- Average gift to date is **\$94.38** (\$31,147/330);
- **568** Cabrini Households have yet to respond or **63%** (568/898) of the Cabrini Parish membership and who could certainly help us reach our goal!;
- **\$31,147** has been raised or **87.3%** (\$31,147/\$35,700) of goal;

Sincere thanks to each of the **330** Cabrini Households who have helped us come ever so close to our goal. You’ve done a very fine job, Kudos to you! I call upon those **568** Cabrini Households (**63%** of the parish) to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese. Households who choose not to participate hurt the Parish in the long run because we have to divert regular and fund-raising income to cover the *Appeal* shortfall. Group of **568**, your participation can help us wrap up this effort in no time. Only **\$4,553** remains to reach our goal. . . spread out between **568** households. . . it’s certainly an achievable goal! The books close on the *2016 Bishop’s Appeal* close at the end of the calendar year.

pasta, spaghetti sauce, rice, Kraft Dinner (mac & cheese) canned vegetables, canned or dried soup

J through R:

stove top stuffing/ instant mashed potatoes, canned meat, gravy, canned fruit

S through Z:

peanut butter, jelly, crackers, cereal, canned tuna, pork & beans, pudding/jello
