“Off Week” Report, Bishop’s Appeal. . .

If you are one of the **330** Cabrini Households (**37%**) who have participated. . . thank you! If you are one of the **568** Cabrini Households who have not yet participated (**63%**), please join the effort to help your parish meet its goal amount for 2016! This is an “off week” in reporting of *Appeal* results so here is where we stand as of last week’s statistics:

- **330** Cabrini Households have participated or **36.8%** of parish (330/898);
- Average gift to date is **\$94.38** (\$31,147/330);
- **568** Cabrini Households have yet to respond or **63%** (568/898) of the Cabrini Parish membership and who could certainly help us reach our goal!;
- **\$31,147** has been raised or **87.3%** (\$31,147/\$35,700) of goal;

Sincere thanks to each of the **330** Cabrini Households who have helped us come ever so close to our goal. You’ve done a very fine job, Kudos to you! A gentle encouraging nudge to those **568** Cabrini Households (**63%** of the parish) to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese. Households who choose not to participate hurt the Parish in the long run because we have to divert regular and fund-raising income to cover the *Appeal* shortfall. Group of **568**, your participation can help us wrap up this effort in no time. Only **\$4,653** remains to reach our goal (**13%**). . . Spread out between **568** households. . . we can do it!

Large, small or in the middle. . . every household’s gift and participation is important to Appeal’s success. Group of 568, make your contribution, help close the Appeal and put me out of this reporting job! **THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN
ORDINARY TIME**

First Reading: Malachi 3:19-20a

The prophet Malachi warned that the time would come when all the evil people would be punished. He then speaks of the arrival of "the sun of justice, with its healing rays," believed by most to mean Jesus.

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Some of the Thessalonians claimed Christ's return was imminent, so they stopped working and asked others for food. Paul describes his willingness to work, so that he would not impose on others. He encourages them to follow his example and earn their own living.

Gospel: Luke 21:5-19

Jesus warns of the persecution all Christians will face because of him, and how some will even be put to death. Yet he says they will not be harmed because "by patient endurance you will save your lives." If Jesus' followers are loyal, they will be resurrected and their suffering will end.
