***2016 Bishop's Appeal
Report:***

In this past week, we didn't hear from any of the remaining **559** Cabrini Households who have not yet participated in the *2016 Bishop's Appeal* so our statistics remain the same as last week:

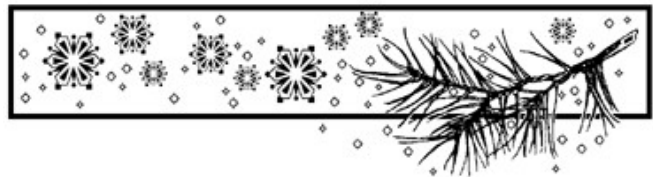
- **\$32,082** has been raised or **89.9%** (\$32,082/\$35,700) of goal;
- **339** Cabrini Households have participated or **37.8%** of parish (339/898);
- Average gift to date is **\$94.63** (\$32,082/336);
- **559** Cabrini Households have yet to respond or **62.2%** (559/898) of the Cabrini Parish membership, and who could certainly help us reach our goal!

Sincere thanks to each of the **339** Cabrini Households who have helped us come "whisker close" to the **90%** mark of our 2016 goal. These Cabrini Households have done such a fine job with their participation/gifts! With just a couple of weeks left to close the 2016 *Appeal* books, I call upon those **559** Cabrini Households (*almost two-thirds of the parish*) to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese. Households who choose not to participate hurt the Parish in the long run because we have to divert regular and fund-raising income to cover the *Appeal* shortfall. Only **\$3,618** remains to reach our target. Spread out between **559** not-yet-participating households. . . it's certainly an achievable goal! The books close on the *2016 Bishop's Appeal* at

the end of December. If you haven't already done so, please make your gift as soon as possible so the parish will receive credit before the year closes. For bookkeeping purposes, make your 2016 Appeal gift BEFORE Christmas to allow for complete processing in December. We will acknowledge and thank all those Cabrini Households who participated via a printed report in the New Year.

Large, small or in the middle. . . every household's gift and participation is important to Appeal's success. Group of 559, make your contribution, help close the Appeal and bring us to victory! Thanks again "Group of 339"! - You've brought us close to 90% of goal!!!

December 18, 2016 Fourth Sunday of Advent

First Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14

Ahaz receives from Isaiah a prophecy that he will be successful in war and is urged to ask for a sign that the prophecy is true. The sign is "The virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel."

Second Reading: Romans 1:1-7

Paul greets the Romans by pointing out that Jesus is the Christ who was promised to them in Scripture. He, Paul, is the apostle favored with the task of spreading the name of Christ to all.

Gospel: Matthew 1:18-24

In a brief, straightforward, simple narrative, Matthew recounts the events leading to Jesus' birth. He details the appearance of the angel in a dream to Joseph and stresses that "All this happened to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophets."
