The Solemnity of Mary

"When the eighth day came, they gave him the name Jesus"

In one sense we cram a lot of things together in today's solemnity: whether we succeed or not is open to debate! Today is New Year's Day, a time to pray for the year to come and hope for God's blessing. It is the Octave Day of Christmas, when we continue to reflect on the meaning of the child in the manger. It is the day of Jesus' circumcision, according to the Law of Moses, and the day on which he was given the name that the angel had announced to Mary. And the name of this day tells us that it is given to Mary, mother of Jesus, God-made-man, not in any other aspect of her life (such as the Annunciation, the Assumption or the Immaculate Conception), but celebrated simply as Mother of the Redeemer. Perhaps it is the person of Mary the Mother who can unite all these themes: she who trusted in God's promises received blessings from the Lord; as mother she invites us to look over her shoulder with the shepherds and recognize her child, not just as a wonderful new life, but as the one who (in fulfilment of the Scriptures) is proclaimed as Jesus, a name which means God saves.
