2017 - Bishop's Lenten Appeal Report

25% of Cabrini Households Participating thus Far. . .

As of Monday, June 5, here are our refreshed statistics of our parish's participation in the 2017 Annual Bishop's Appeal. We are eagerly awaiting to hear from those Cabrini Households who have yet to participate to help us meet our fiscal stewardship to the Harrisburg Diocese. The good news thus far is as follows:

- 11 new gifts received, totaling \$635.00, since the last report;
- Total received to date: \$23,300, 64.4% of goal (\$23,300/\$36,200);
- 219 Cabrini Households participating or 24.6% of Parish (219/890);
- Average gift stands at \$106.39;
- Awaiting response from 671 or 75% of the parish's households;
- \$12,900 is needed to meet our goal.

Special thanks and blessings to the wonderful "Gang of 211" who have brought us to almost two-thirds of our goal amount. "Gang of 671," help us wrap up the appeal with your contribution to the final third of our goal amount!?!? Your already participating fellow Cabrini households would love to see you come on board!

Updated *Appeal* reports are published bi-weekly.

Large, small or in the middle, every Cabrini Household's participation and gift is critical to meeting our collective Stewardship responsibility to the Diocese!

Last weekend, we celebrated Pentecost Sunday, "The
Birth-Day of the Church" and the official close of the

opportunity to express my sincere thanks to all the very
dedicated "Cabrini Easter Egg Workers" who toiled so
faithfully for many weeks in producing our delicious
eggs. I also acknowledge and thank all those all those
parishioners who took our Cabrini Eggs to family,
