## 5 New Donors Add to Bishop's Appeal

This is an "off week" for reporting our Lenten Appeal Update. The information below is our Appeal Status as of June 19<sup>th</sup>.

We are eagerly awaiting to hear from the Cabrini Households who have yet to participate to help us meet our fiscal stewardship to the Harrisburg Diocese.

The good news thus far is as follows:

- 5 new gifts received, totaling **\$190.00**, since the last report;
- Total received to date: **\$23,490, 64.8%** of goal (\$23,490/\$36,200);
- **224** Cabrini Households participating or **25.2%** of Parish (224/890);
- Average gift stands at **\$104.86**;
- Awaiting response from **666** or **75%** of the parish's households;
- Only **\$12,710** (spread out among **666** Cabrini Households) is needed to meet our goal.

Special thanks and blessings to the wonderful "**Gang of 224 Cabrini Households**" who have brought us to almost two-thirds of our goal amount. "**Gang of 666**," help us wrap up the appeal with your contribution to the final third of our goal amount!?!? Your already participating fellow Cabrini households would love to see you come on board!!

### Please Note Change in July Mission Co-Op Envelope. . .

Due to a schedule change, the **Mission Co-Op** originally scheduled for **JULY 8/9** has been moved to **AUGUST 19/20**. Please hold this July envelope until the August 19/20 collection. The **Franciscan Mission Appeal** (envelope in your August packet) is still scheduled for the weekend of August 12/13. Thank you for your understanding.

**Kudos to our local Knights of Columbus, Council #458!** The Council recently spearheaded a fund raising effort in conjunction with K of C Councils in Elysburg, Kulpmont, Mt. Carmel, Ashland and Danville. Through these combined efforts and a lot of hard work, the Knights raised \$12,000 to help purchase an ultrasound machine for our local Pregnancy Care Center (PCC) in Shamokin. This \$12,000 effort was matched by a \$12,000 matching grant of the Supreme Council Knights of Columbus. By purchasing the \$24,000 ultrasound equipment, the PCC can provide ultrasounds for pregnant women right on Market Street. 90% of women who are considering an abortion decide to carry the pregnancy to term after viewing the ultrasound of their developing baby. Thank you Knights for contributing to the betterment of our community and to supporting the culture of life!

**First Reading: 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a**

A woman in Shunem believed strongly in the holiness of the prophet Elisha. To reward her, Elisha promised that she and her aging husband would, within the year, be the parents of a son.

**Second Reading: Romans 6:3-4, 8-11**

Paul explains to the Romans that by immersion in water at baptism, they “die” to their sins; by rising from the water, they rise from “death and sin” to new life in Christ.

**Gospel: Matthew 10:37-42**

With simplicity, Jesus tells his apostles that everyone should love him above all others -- father, mother, son or daughter. He adds, “He who welcomes you, welcomes me.”

**“Whoever receives you receives me and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me... And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because this little one is a disciple, amen, I say to you he will surely not lose his reward.”**

One of the gifts Pope Francis extols, is the gift of hospitality. In our families, in our church, we have the ability to open the door and make others feel welcome. A familiar Irish expression reads “A Hundred Thousand Welcome.”

Elisha the prophet in the Book of Kings, was offered hospitality by a wealthy woman, and she was rewarded for her gift. The person ready and willing to give ONLY a cup of cold water in the name of Jesus to a little one will not go without a reward.

In the past it was not common to see people carrying a water bottle in public. Sometimes we looked for a fountain for a drink. Maybe the gift of water and hospitality for us can be welcoming a stranger, assisting someone in need, listening to a person who has suffered a loss or suffering a sickness. Whatever gesture I offer
