Bishop's Lenten Appeal Report

Due to an early bulletin printing deadline, we cannot supply new Bishop's Appeal Date.

The numbers below as of Monday, June 19th.

We are getting there, gift by gift, household by household. It is with great anticipation that we await to hear from the majority of Cabrini Households who have yet to participate in helping us meet our fiscal stewardship to the Harrisburg Diocese. The good news thus far is as follows:

- 5 new gifts received, totaling **\$190.00**, since the last report;
- Total received to date: **\$23,490, 64.8%** of goal (\$23,490/\$36,200);
- **224** Cabrini Households participating or **25.2%** of Parish (224/890);
- Average gift stands at **\$104.86**;
- Awaiting response from **666** or **75%** of the parish's households;
- Only **\$12,710** (spread out among **666** Cabrini Households) is needed to meet our goal.

Special thanks and blessings to the wonderful "**224 Cabrini Households**" who have brought us to almost two-thirds of our goal amount. If yours is one of the "**666 Cabrini Households**" who have not yet participated, won't you help us wrap up the appeal with your contribution to the final third of our goal amount!?!? Your already participating fellow parishioners would love to see you come on board! And, you can put me out of this reporting job! Thanks!

Updated *Appeal* reports are published bi-weekly.

Large, small or in the middle, every Cabrini Household's participation and gift is critical to meeting our collective Stewardship responsibility to the Diocese!

It's Official, We have a New Roof!

In the final days of June, **Budget Roofing** completed the total replacement of the parish office building roof. I commend Mr. Jim Searls and the Budget Roofing workers for their professional manner and quality workmanship. Given its height, its tight situation on our property and the multi roof levels, the job was a challenging one. Work included: On the main and rear roofs, removing of exiting ballast, tear off old roofing and insulation; install new insulation with new .060 fully adhered rubber roof; install new aluminum edging; tear off existing shingles on main top roof and two side porch roofs, down to sheathing; complete install new aluminum edging and one ply felt; re-shingle roof with life time shingles; repaint all metal roofs on top of 3rd story windows; clean up and haul all debris. The shed roof behind the office building was also re-shingled. Total cost for the project was \$58,735.00. Thank God, no more leaks in the office building!

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
July 9, 2017

"At that time Jesus exclaimed: 'I give praise to you Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to the little ones. Yes, Father, such has been your gracious will... Come to me all you who labor and are burdened and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon your shoulders for I am meek and humble of heart and you will find rest for yourselves.'"

Recently while watching a film clip with youth in a bible study, it was clear that they had a greater understanding of the message than I. They saw things, images, heard music, which revealed a deeper meaning and understanding of the lesson at hand. Yes, God does reveal to the childlike things which often pass us by.

The message for all of us is to place our trust and confidence in the Lord and in responding to His call, learn from Him and the little ones. He reveals Himself as meek and humble, two of the beatitudes which we are called to live. As the minister translated the beatitudes at the inauguration 'God blesses the poor in Spirit, God blesses the meek, God blesses the humble... He surely does.'
