**Gift by Gift, Bishop's Appeal
Moves Forward!**

Here's where we stand as of October 2 with our Bishop's Appeal endeavor:

- 4 new gifts received since last report, totaling **\$890**;
- Total received to date: **\$26,943**, **74.4%** of goal (\$26,943/\$36,200);
- **275** Cabrini Households participating or **30.9%** of Parish (275/890);
- Average gift stands at **\$97.97**;
- Awaiting response from **615** or **69%** of the parish's households;
- Only **\$9,257** (spread out among **615** Cabrini Households) is needed to meet our goal.

Special thanks and blessings to the wonderful "**275 Cabrini Households**" who have brought us to **74.4%** of our goal amount. If yours is one of the "**615 Cabrini Households**" who have not yet participated, won't you help us wrap up the appeal with your contribution?!? On September 27, 2017, all the Bishops of Pennsylvania gathered for a special Mass at St. Patrick Cathedral in Harrisburg, along with many clergy (Frs. Martin & Adam attended) and laity to entrust the ecclesial province of Pennsylvania to Our Lady of Fatima. 2017 marks the 100th Anniversary of the apparitions of Mary to the three simple Portuguese children, Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta at Fatima.

To insure food safety, **please do not donate expired products nor damaged containers**.

If you choose to use the last name alphabet system, we invite you to donate the following:

A through I:

pasta, spaghetti sauce, rice, Kraft Dinner (mac & cheese)
canned vegetables, canned beef stew

J through R:

stove top stuffing/ instant mashed potatoes,
gravy, canned fruit, pudding/jello, canned meat

S through Z:

peanut butter, jelly, crackers, cereal,
canned tuna, canned or dried soup

**Twenty–Seventh Sunday
in Ordinary Time
October 8, 2017**

First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

This passage about the failure of the Lord’s vineyard is a metaphor for the ingratitude of the people of Israel and Judah. In tones of sadness and rebuke, the Lord asks, “What more was there to do for my vineyard?”

Second Reading: Philippians 4:6-9

In a moving appeal to the Philippians, Paul exhorts them to embrace all that is pure, decent, and admirable; then God’s peace will be theirs.

Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

In another rebuke to the chief priests and the elders, Jesus recounts a parable in which the owner of a vineyard leases his vineyard to tenant farmers. When the owner sends his servants and even his son to claim his rightful share of the crops, the tenants kill all of them. With some bitterness, Jesus warns the chief priests that “the Kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to people that will yield a rich harvest.
