2017 Bishop's Appeal

This is an "off week" for reporting Bishop's Appeal statistics so the following data is of last week. Look to next week's bulletin for updated information.

- 4 new gifts received since last report, totaling **\$890**;
- Total received to date: **\$26,943**, **74.4%** of goal (\$26,943/\$36,200);
- **275** Cabrini Households participating or **30.9%** of Parish (275/890);
- Average gift stands at **\$97.97**;
- Awaiting response from **615** or **69%** of the parish's households;
- Only **\$9,257** (spread out among **615** Cabrini Households) is needed to meet our goal.

Special thanks and blessings to the wonderful "**275 Cabrini Households**" who have brought us to **74.4%** of our goal amount. If yours is one of the "**615 Cabrini Households**" who have not yet participated, won't you help us wrap up the appeal with your contribution?!? Those who already made their contribution await you and would love to see you come on board! And, you can put me out of this reporting job! Thanks! Updated *Appeal* reports are published bi-weekly.

CONSECRATION OF THE HARRISBURG DIOCESE TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY OF FATIMA

On September 27, 2017, all the Bishops of Pennsylvania gathered for a special Mass at St. Patrick Cathedral in Harrisburg, along with many clergy (Frs. Martin & Adam attended) and laity to entrust the ecclesial province of Pennsylvania to Our Lady of Fatima. 2017 marks the 100th Anniversary of the apparitions of Mary to the three simple Portuguese children, Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta at Fatima.

By extension of this holy event, Bishop Gainer asks that all parishes of the Diocese to set aside the normal prayers and readings for the 28th Sunday of Ordinary Time and to celebrate the *Votive Mass of Our Lady, Model of the Church* at each of the Sunday Masses throughout the Diocese this weekend, October 14-15.

During this weekend of October 14-15, each of the parishes within each of the Dioceses of Pennsylvania will pray the prayer of Consecration of Our Lady of Fatima.

We pray Mary's intercession upon us, Mother Cabrini Parish, our Diocese and upon our nation!

To help insure a variety of food items, we suggest the breakdown of donations by alphabet, last name. (**The alphabet system is a suggestion**). Feel free to donate any food items that you wish. It helps us if you bring your donation directly to the parish office during office hours. You may also leave your food donation in the church vestibule if it's more convenient for you. To insure food safety, **please do not donate expired products nor damaged containers.**

If you choose to use the last name alphabet system, we invite you to donate the following:

A through I:

pasta, spaghetti sauce, rice, Kraft Dinner (mac & cheese)
canned vegetables, canned beef stew

J through R:

stove top stuffing/ instant mashed potatoes,
gravy, canned fruit, pudding/jello, canned meat

S through Z:

peanut butter, jelly, crackers, cereal,
canned tuna, canned or dried soup

Special Readings for this Sunday

First Reading: Genesis 3:9-15, 20

In this passage from the Book of Genesis, we hear of Adam's fall and of how the servant tricked Eve into eating of the forbidden fruit. The serpent is cursed by God and the promise is given of the "woman" who is to come, and whose son will put enmity between himself and the serpent. Mary becomes the "New Eve."

Second Reading: Galatians 4:4-7

St. Paul tells the Galatians that in "the fullness of time," God sent his Son, born of a woman (Mary), to ransom us so that we might adopted heirs and thus receive God's inheritance.

Gospel: John 19:25-27

Mary stands at the foot of her son's cross. Jesus speaks from the cross to his mother, "Woman, behold your son (who is John, the beloved disciple); and then to John he says, "Behold, your mother." Thus, Jesus entrusts his mother to the mission of the disciples, the Church.
