“Off Week Report,” 2018 Bishop’s Appeal Data. . .

As of October 1st, here is where Mother Cabrini Parish stands with our *Appeal* Stewardship Obligation to the Diocese:

- **243** Cabrini Households have responded with their contributions;
- **28.9%** Cabrini Household have brought us to **73.0% of goal, 243/841**;
- **\$24,538** collected in gifts and pledges;
- **73.0%** of goal achieved to date, **\$24,538/\$33,600**;
- Only **\$9,062** remains to reach our goal, spread out among **71.1%** of the parish;
- Average gift to date: **\$100.98**;
- Waiting to hear from **598** Cabrini Households, **71.1%** of the parish;
- Largest gift, \$1,000; smallest gift, \$3; and a broad spectrum of gift amounts in between.

Heartfelt thanks to each of the **243** Cabrini Households who have helped us get to this point in the campaign. **598** Cabrini Households who have not yet responded. . . Won’t you please join your fellow Cabrini Households and help us reach out goal with your gift/participation!?!?

To help insure a variety of food items, we suggest the breakdown of donations by alphabet, last name. (**The alphabet system is a suggestion**). Feel free to donate any food items that you wish. It helps us if you bring your donation directly to the parish office during office hours. You may also leave your food donation in the church vestibule if it's more convenient for you. To insure food safety, **please do not donate expired products nor damaged containers**.

If you choose to use the last name alphabet system, we invite you to donate the following:

A through I:

pasta, spaghetti sauce, rice, Kraft Dinner (mac & cheese)
canned vegetables, canned beef stew

J through R:

stove top stuffing/ instant mashed potatoes,
gravy, canned fruit, pudding/jello, canned meat

S through Z:

peanut butter, jelly, crackers, cereal, canned tuna, canned
or dried soup

**TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY
IN ORDINARY TIME**

First Reading: Wisdom 7:7-11

This poem discusses how the spirit of wisdom is far more beautiful than any riches could be. All gold is no more than sand when compared to the importance of wisdom, which often leads people to the other good things in life.

Second Reading: Hebrews 4:12-13

God's perception of people is called "sharper than any two-edged sword." God is able to know the thoughts and feelings of all his people. We can hide nothing from him, and will need to account for all he has seen in us.

Gospel: Mark 10:17-30

A man asks Jesus how he can share in everlasting life. Jesus tells him to sell his possessions and travel with them. The man refuses and Jesus tells his disciples how difficult it is for a rich person to enter heaven if they are too concerned with their possessions. The disciples remind Jesus that they gave up everything for him, but he assures them they will be rewarded with everlasting life.
