Annual Campaign

This is an off week for reporting *Campaign* results. These statistics are **as of April 30**, concerning our *2019 Diocesan Campaign*. I express most sincere thanks to each of the **23** most recent Mother Cabrini Parish Households who responded with their contributions. Your participation and generosity is most heartening and inspiring. The updated figures are as follows:

- **92** Cabrini Households have participated or **11.1%** (**92/829**) of our active registered Cabrini households;
- Total received in gifts and pledges **\$12,021**;
- Average gift as of this report is **\$130.66**;
- **92** Cabrini Households have brought us to **34.6%** of goal (\$12,021/\$34,700).
- We hope to hear from the remaining **737** Cabrini Households (**88.9%** of the parish, **737/829**) in the weeks ahead;

I voice my most sincere thanks to each of those **92** Cabrini Households who have provided the initial solid foundation to this year's *Campaign*. I appeal to all Cabrini households to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese.
