1 "On Week" Report Annual Campaign 6 New Households Came on Board!

The follow are refreshed *Campaign* data, as of May 13th. I express most sincere thanks to each of the 6 most recent Mother Cabrini Parish Households who responded with their contributions/pledges of \$570. Your participation and generosity is most heartening and inspiring. The updated figures are as follows:

- 98 Cabrini Households have participated or 11.8% (98/829) of our active registered Cabrini households;
- Total received in gifts and pledges \$12,591;
- Average gift as of this report is \$128.48;
- 98 Cabrini Households have brought us to 36.3% of goal (\$12,591/\$34,700).
- Please God, we hope to hear from the remaining 731 Cabrini Households (88.1% of the parish, (731/829) in the weeks ahead.

I voice my most sincere thanks to each of those 98 Cabrini Households who have brought us to over a third of the way to our 2019 *Campaign* goal. I appeal to all Cabrini households to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese. Every household's participation is critical. Fifth Sunday of Easter**

First Reading: Acts 14:21-27

Paul and Barnabas traveled to many towns and found many disciples willing to help them preach. They warned their disciples of the trials they would face. Paul and Barnabas then returned to Antioch, where their journey had begun, and told the congregation there of the progress they had made.

Second Reading: Revelation 21:1-5a

John had a vision of a new earth, and a new Jerusalem coming down from heaven. Then a voice described Jerusalem as a place where God would live among his people and comfort them. The former world had vanished, and pain, death and suffering had left the world as well.

Gospel: John 13:31-33a, 34-35

After Judas left the last supper, Jesus warned the other disciples that he would not be with them much longer. Jesus gave them a new commandment to love one another as he had loved them. He stated that their love for each other would distinguish them as his disciples.
