## “On Week” Report, Diocesan Annual Campaign

As of August 5<sup>th</sup>, here is where we stand as a parish relative to the **2019 Diocesan Annual Campaign**: we have received **5** new contributions and **2** “add to my previous gift” donations totaling **\$620**. I express most sincere thanks to each of the **7** most recent Mother Cabrini Parish Households who responded with their contributions/pledges/additional gifts. Your participation and generosity is very much appreciated. The updated parish figures are as follows:

- **126** Cabrini Households have participated or **15.2%** (126/829) of our active registered Cabrini households;
- Total received in gifts and pledges **\$16,406**;
- Average gift as of this report is **\$130.21**;
- **126** Cabrini Households have brought us to **47.3% of goal (\$16,406/\$34,700)**.
- Please God, we hope to hear from the remaining **703** Cabrini Households (**84.8%** of the parish, **708/829**) in the weeks ahead.

I extend my most sincere thanks to each of those **126** Cabrini Households who have brought us closer to the **50%** mark of our 2019 Campaign goal. I appeal to all Cabrini households to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese. All monies collected through the Campaign, fund very important charitable works within the Diocese. So, every household’s participation is critical. Any unpaid balance of the ‘19 Campaign will have to come out of our ordinary parish income. . . and that hurts the parish financially. *Large, small or in the middle, every household’s gift and every household’s participation is important to our common success.* My “Sincerest Thank You” to our **126** participants!!

## August 11,, 2019 NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### First Reading: Wisdom 18:6-9

In this excerpt, the Israelites are reminded that they were warned before God sent an angel to slay the first born of the Egyptians. God called on them to have courage, and then rewarded them by punishing their enemies and leading them from captivity.

### Second Reading: Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19

Faith is described as true belief even toward things we cannot see. Abram's faith in God was so deep that he wandered through a foreign land, convinced God's promise of a homeland was sincere. God honored his promise to give Abram many descendants, and was proud of the deep faith Abram and his people possessed.

### Gospel: Luke 12:32-48

Jesus encourages us to be prepared for his return at all times, for he will come when we least expect him. He tells of a master who entrusts his home to his servants, and fully expects them to be awaiting his return. In the same manner, Jesus can arrive at any moment and expects us to be prepared for his return.
