“Off Week” Report, Diocesan Annual Campaign, 15.8% Parish Participation

As of September 30th, here is where we stand as a parish relative to the **2019 Diocesan Annual Campaign**: since the last report, we received **1** new contribution and **3** “add to my previous gift” donations totaling **\$120**. I am most appreciative to each of these **4** most recent Mother Cabrini Parish Households who responded with their contributions/pledges/additional gifts. Your participation and generosity is very much appreciated. The updated data are as follows:

- **131** Cabrini Households have participated or **15.8%** (**131/829**) of our active registered Cabrini households;
- Total received in gifts and pledges **\$16,821**;
- Average gift as of this report is **\$128.40**;
- **131** Cabrini Households have brought us to **48.5%** of goal (**\$16,821/\$34,700**).
- Please God, we hope to hear from the remaining **698** Cabrini Households (**84.1%** of the parish, **698/829**) in the weeks ahead.

I extend my most sincere thanks to each of those **131** Cabrini Households who have brought us to a little shy of the **50%** mark of our 2019 *Campaign* goal. I earnestly appeal to all Cabrini households who haven't yet done so to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese. All monies collected through the Campaign, fund very important charitable works within the Diocese. So, every household's participation is critical. Any unpaid balance of the '19 Campaign will have to come out of our ordinary parish income. . . and that hurts the parish financially. *Large, small or in the middle, every household's gift and every household's participation is important to our common success.* My “Sincerest Thank You” and a “God Bless You!” to our **131** household participants!!
