Fr. Paul Schloemer, OFM Conv., to Preach Cabrini 40 Hours Devotions

Friar Paul Schloemer is the Formation Director for the Conventual Franciscans in Silver Spring, MD. A Notre Dame graduate, he served five years as a Naval Officer, and then

attained an MS in psychology from Old Dominion University before entering the Franciscans. He received an MA in theology form The Catholic University of America, and completed his theological studies at the University of Wuerzburg in Germany. He made his solemn profession of vows with the Franciscans in 2001, and was ordained to the Presbyterate in 2004. After ordination, he served 3 years as Associate Pastor at St. Joseph's Church in Terre Haute, IN, 7 years in the Vocation Office for the Our Lady of Consolation Province (Midwest and Southwest USA), and 4 years as Formation Director in San Antonio, TX before moving to Maryland.

"On Week" Report, '19 Diocesan Annual Campaign

As of October 28th, here are our updated statistics relative to the 2019 Diocesan Annual Campaign: we received 1 new contribution totaling \$25. I express most sincere thanks to the most recent Mother Cabrini Parish Household who responded with their gift. Your participation and generosity is very much appreciated. The updated data are as follows:

- 135 Cabrini Households have participated or 16.3% (135/829) of our active registered Cabrini households;
- Total received in gifts and pledges \$17,046;
- Average gift as of this report is \$126.27;
- **135** Cabrini Households have brought us to 49.1% of goal (\$17,046/\$34,700);
- Please God, in the weeks ahead ,we hope to hear from the remaining 694 Cabrini Households (83.7% of the parish, 694/829) to help us close the \$17,654 gap.

I extend my most sincere thanks to each of those 134 Cabrini Households who have brought us to almost 50% mark of our 2019 *Campaign* goal. I appeal to all Cabrini households to join with your fellow parishioners to help the parish meet its stewardship responsibility to the Diocese. All monies collected through the Campaign, fund very important charitable works within the Diocese. So, every household's participation is critical. Any unpaid balance of the '19 Campaign will have to come out of our ordinary parish income. . . and that hurts the parish financially. Large, small or in the middle, every household's gift and every household's participation is important to our common success. November 3, 2019 Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Wisdom 11:22-12:2

In this reading, we are reminded of the love God feels toward every creature, or else he would not have created them. God shows mercy on our sins and hopes we will repent and have faith in him.

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2

Paul tells the Thessalonians that God will make them worthy of his call, so that they can be glorified in Christ. Paul also tells them he is unsure when Christ will come again, but urges them not to believe people who falsely state that Jesus has returned.

Gospel: Luke 19:1-10

Zacchaeus, the wealthy chief tax collector in Jericho, was very excited when Jesus came to town and asked to stay with him. People were angry that Jesus would go to a sinner's home. Zacchaeus then told Jesus he planned to give half of his belongings to the poor, and repay any person he had cheated. Jesus was delighted since his mission was "to search out and save what was lost."
