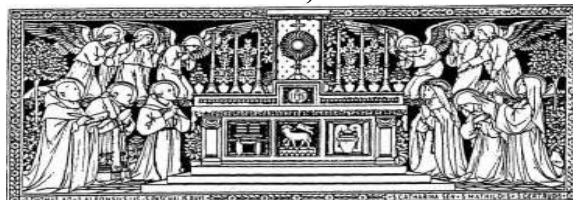

**Fr. Paul Schloemer, OFM Conv.,
to Preach Cabrini
40 Hours Devotions**



Friar Paul Schloemer is the Formation Director for the Conventual Franciscans in Silver Spring, MD. A Notre Dame graduate, he served five years as a Naval Officer, and then attained an MS in psychology from Old Dominion University before entering the Franciscans. He received an MA in theology from The Catholic University of America, and completed his theological studies at the University of Wuerzburg in Germany. He made his solemn profession of vows with the Franciscans in 2001, and was ordained to the Presbyterate in 2004. After ordination, he served 3 years as Associate Pastor at St. Joseph's Church in Terre Haute, IN, 7 years in the Vocation Office for the Our Lady of Consolation Province (Midwest and Southwest USA), and 4 years as Formation Director in San Antonio, TX before moving to Maryland.

Fr. Paul will be available for confessions after the Sunday & Monday evening services.

**We Welcome Baltimore Native,
Fr. Stephen King, OFM Conv.
to Mother Cabrini!**

We are happy to announce that with the approval of Most Rev. Ronald Gainer, Bishop of Harrisburg, Fr. Stephen King has been approved as Parochial Vicar for Mother Cabrini Parish. Fr. Steve will arrive at Mother Cabrini Friary on Friday, November 15th.

Fr. Steve was born on May 26, 1966, and raised in Baltimore, MD. After working seven years in the Data Processing area he joined the former Saint Anthony of Padua Province, now Our Lady of the Angels Province, of the Conventual Franciscans. Following ordination, he has spent time in the parochial and high school educational ministries of the Province. In more recent years he has worked in the formation and higher education ministries of the Franciscan Order.

He was a Lecturer and Director of Franciscan Studies at the Franciscan International Study Centre in Canterbury, England. This year he has successfully completed a Doctor of Philosophy degree in Christian Spirituality at the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, CA. His dissertation concerned the relationship between the earliest, thirteenth century images of Saint Francis and the development of Franciscan spirituality. Outside of his ministerial life, he is interested in reading, especially history, and railroad and maritime history, in particular. He is an amateur radio operator, and is licensed, Fr. Steve has served as a commercial maritime radiotelegraph operator. He is looking forward to sharing life and ministry with the people of Shamokin.
